Situated: 25 km North-West of Bettiah, 3 km west on Valmiki Road.

Significance: Spread across an area of 6000 square metres, it is considered to be one of the biggest Stupa, among the Stupas found in the country.

Ashokan Pillars

Five Asokan pillars situates in Bihar. The edicts inscribed on the pillars which are the verdicts of Ashoka, setting forth objectives and rules. Out of the several pillars built by him only nineteen pillars with the edicts survived. The pillars were made in red sand stones and carried at Chunar, a place at the south of Varanasi. These pillars were later carried to the places wherever they were supposed to be erected.

I - Ashokan Pillar in Kolhua, Vaishali,

2 - Ashokan Pillars- (two) in Rampurva, West Champaran,

3 - Ashokan Pillar in Lauria Nandangarh, West Champaran, 4 - Ashokan Pillar in Areraĵ, East Champaran.
