Computerized Learner's License Scheme Proves A Big Hit



The Transport Department, Bihar had launched the Computerized Learner's License Test (CLLT) module on 10th March, 2013 at Patna Transport Office with the objective to replace the then manual-testing process. This is the first time such a computer-aided learners' license test is being conducted in the state.

Presently, to apply for the learner's driving license candidates first need to fill the required forms and then submit them at the counter with due fees. The candidate is then given a receipt and is asked to move to the test room. On submitting the receipt the candidate is given a computer generated token which has in it mentioned the machine number on which the candidate must take the test. The CLLT module contains a set of 60 questions of which 10 questions are randomly selected by the module. In a single session six applicants can appear where they would have to answer 6 multiple-choice questions correctly out of 10. The questions, to be answered in 30 seconds, would be related to points such as traffic rules, driving signs and vehicle control. Once an applicant qualifies in the test, a certified copy of the learners' license with a unique number is generated.
