The Indian Parliament of India has enacted the Architects Act, 1972, to regulate the standard of the Architectural Education and Profession in the Country. The Council has also been vested with the responsibility of registering Architects on all India basis similar to Bar Council, Institution of Chartered Accountants of India and National Medical Commission.

The Govt's initiatives such as "Smart Cities", "Housing for All, Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojna, AMRUT, Namami Gange, and construction of public buildings like, Secretariat, Courts, Jails, Hospitals, Police Stations, Museum, Hotels, Stadiums, Highways and Expressways, Guest Houses, Row Housing, etc. requires essential contribution from the Architects.

The role of architects in the construction of buildings extends beyond building design. They are entrusted with creating environments that provide warmth, comfort, and protection against both natural and human-made extremes. Their responsibilities include ensuring the efficient utilization of space, natural resources, energy, and construction materials, while simultaneously upholding aesthetic values that harmonize with the cultural and historical context.

The Council's attention has repeatedly been drawn to the limited role assigned to architects in the construction of public buildings and the lack of recruitment to fill vacant posts in the architectural cadre. It has also been brought to the Council's notice that non-architects are being promoted or appointed to posts carrying the designation "Architect" or involving the duties and functions of an architect in government departments and local authorities.

In this regard, we would like to inform you that the Hon'ble Madhya Pradesh High Court in Mukesh Kumar Manhar v/s. State of Madhya Pradesh vide judgment dated 02.08.2005 held as under:

Para 19:

i) "The State Government (first respondent) shall cease using the nomenclature "Assistant Architects" or "Architects" in regard to posts for which the qualification of "Registered Architect" is not prescribed. It shall also cease designating those who are not registered Architects under the Architects Act, 1972, as 'Architects' or 'Assistant Architects'.

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ii) *If the State Government wants to continue the nomenclature of "Assistant Architect" or "Architects", then while prescribing the qualification for appointment or promotion to such posts, the requirement that they shall be "Registered Architect" under the Architects Act, 1972, shall be added.*

iii) *The State shall give preference to Registered Architects (under the Architects Act, 1972) for appointment to any post of Architect (that is post involving architectural functions) as provided in Section 35(2) of the Architects Act, 1972".*

Further, Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in Civil Appeal No. 1819 of 2020 vide judgment dated 17th March, 2020 held that only an Architect can be appointed to post of Architect. Copies of the above judgments are enclosed herewith for your kind perusal.

Thus, the State Governments are requested to not to allow non-Architects to be appointed/promoted to any post which carries the title and style of an Architect and/or duties and functions of an Architect.

The Council after having consultations at all India level has prescribed its Manual on Role of Architects in Public Services which inter alia includes organization set up for Architects, working conditions and composition of Department of Architecture & Establishments. A copy of Manual is enclosed herewith for your kind perusal.

Accordingly, it is humbly requested that appropriate directions be issued to concerned Departments/ Local Authorities/ Urban Local Bodies/ Panchayati Raj Institutions:

- a) To comply with the provisions of the Architects Act, 1972 so that the non-architects may not be appointed to posts carrying the designation 'Architect' in government departments and other local authorities.
- b) To strengthen the Cadre of Architects in your State in Govt. Departments/ PSUs/ Local Bodies like PWD, Works, Road & Buildings, Development Authorities, Municipal Corporations etc. in well-structured and pyramidal manner in line with the Guidelines of the Council.

It is further requested that Council may be kept posted with the action taken in the matter.

ROLE OF ARCHITECTS IN PUBLIC SERVICE

P R E F A C E

Architecture is the art and technique of designing and building, as distinguished from the skills associated with construction.

The Parliament of India enacted the Architects Act (No.20 of 1972) to ensure that general public is served by qualified and competent professionals who undergo architectural education and training as per minimum set of standards of architectural education and also for regulating the Architectural Education as well as the Profession of Architects which includes Architects in private practice as well as employed in the Central / State Government Departments and PSUs.

The Council has, in the past, prescribed the Conditions of Engagement and Scale of Charges and Architectural Competitions Guidelines for the practising architects. The present system of carrying out building works in the Government by Public Works departments is a legacy of British rule which gives Civil Engineers, who possess skills associated with construction, a higher status and over-riding responsibilities. However, Architects in spite their comprehensive education and training on Designing, Planning, Execution and aesthetic Management of spaces, are not provided enough responsibility, opportunity and authority to independently exercise their professional skills.

To streamline the anomalies prevalent in Architectural Cadre and to ensure that Architects are positioned at right places to provide their professional services in construction of Public Buildings of the Central/ State Government all over India, the Council has prescribed the Guidelines on Role of Architects in Public Services.

These Guidelines describe the role of Architects employed in Public Service for adoption by the Architectural Department/ Wing of Central / State Government Departments and PSUs. The Guidelines also provide for Statutory provisions, Judicial pronouncements, Organizational Setup for Architects, Architectural Service, Workload, Working conditions, Composition of Department of Architecture and Establishment, Duties and responsibilities of Architectural Cadre etc.

These guidelines are approved in the 75th Meeting held on 28th and 29th August, 2021.

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INTRODUCTION

There is growing awareness of the vital role of Architects in shaping the physical and social environment of the country. In a socialistic pattern of society where the Government is the main builder and client, the role of Architects in public service as a leader of the design and building team rather than an individual professional assumes a special significance.

Similarly, in an economy which is fast becoming integrated with that of the world due to rapid globalization and infusion of latest technologies and global best practices. The role of the Architect in the Private sector too is undergoing fast changes in term of role as Consultant, both in Public or Private Sector, as a regulator, a moderator, coordinator and an Educator.

Thus, there is an urgent need for review of the conditions which prescribe the role and responsibilities of the Architect to make them conducive for growth for Profession of Architecture and for creation of most conducive and nature friendly built environment.

The present system of carrying out building works in the Government by Public Works departments is a legacy of British rule when the country hardly had any architectural manpower as is elaborated in 1.1.2.2 of Volume-1 which gave Civil Engineers a higher status and over-riding responsibilities. In the bureaucratic set up, an Architect in spite of his overall comprehensive training is relegated to a secondary position, subservient to the dominant discipline as an appendage thus obstructing his the independent functioning and professional contribution and accountability towards the project. In this set up the role of the Architect which he is equipped to play is restricted.

In Government Sector, the shortage of human resources and manpower is not a new thing which is often compounded by increase in work load due to rapid increase in need for augmentation of physical infrastructure and the expectations of other Departments from the State Architectural Units are often high. Since the development trajectory of the country is requiring a tremendous increase in upgrading public infrastructure. Sadly, the highly specialized works of preparing vision documents for prestigious projects and their sensitive planning are often equated with monotonous cut and paste jobs of tender documents prepared by Civil Engineers.



Architecture Units remain under constant pressure to deliver at very short notice period and hence the chances of errors creeping in planning can never be ruled out. When the Civil Engineering Departments such as PWD (B&R) have developed a robust system of outsourcing their core works of structure

design, tender document, estimation and costing, the Architecture units are not in sync with such practices and most of the planning and designing

work is a unique & creative process which is done in house. This is all the more important to maintain intellectual memory of such large public projects for the sake of continuity of the planning process for decades.

In order to fulfill his role effectively, an Architect has to function with full control and responsibility for the buildings. Where the full scope of the Architect's function is understood, the people and the nation have reaped the advantage of better design and environment. A living example is the city of Chandigarh in which the Government and the people legitimately take pride and has unquestionably achieved higher standards of architectural quality and urban design than any other city in India, mainly due to the independent status of Department of Architecture. Similarly, the other independent architectural departments have produced better architectural concepts than by the subordinate architectural set-ups, for example, New Delhi Municipal Council (N.D.M.C.), Punjab, Haryana & Himachal Governments, Environmental Planning & Coordination Organisation (EPCO), Govt. of Madhya Pradesh, Bhopal, Delhi Development Authority, and other such Industrial houses. Elsewhere in the rest of the World, the Government Architects are either Heads of the Building Organisations or an independent Department of Architecture.

The urgent need to rationalize an antiquated and obsolete system is a subject of national concern. Government and Municipal agencies handling the problems of housing and building must be reorganized for most efficient and economical functioning. It is a misuse of scarce architectural manpower to subordinate the Architects to any other profession in a manner which prevents the proper exercise of their skills. If the crisis of survival faced by Architects in public service is to be averted by reform of the Public Works Departments, then the Government must see that this is done.



1.0 STATUTORY PROVISIONS :

1.1 **Architect:** Section 2(a) of the Architects Act, 1972 defines an architect to mean a person whose name is for the time being entered in the register maintained by the Council of Architecture.

1.2 **Reference of Architect in any Law in India:** Section 35 (1) of the Architects Act, 1972, provides that any reference in any law for the time being in force to an architect shall be deemed to be a reference to an architect registered under this Act.

1.3 **Preference in Appointment:** Section 35(2) of the Architects Act, 1972, provides that w.e.f. 27.04.1976, a person who is registered in the register maintained by the Council of Architecture shall get preference for appointment as an architect under the Central or State Government or in any other local body or institution which is supported or aided from the public or local funds or in any institution recognized by the Central or State Government.

1.4 **Professional Conduct/ Code of Ethics for Architects:** As provided under Section 22 of the Architects Act, 1972, Council of Architecture has prescribed the regulations for standards of professional conduct and etiquette and a code of ethics, namely, Architects (Professional Conduct) Regulations, 1989 (as amended in 2003). As per these Regulations, every architect either in practice or employment, subject to the provisions of the Central Civil Services (Conduct) Rules, 1964 or any similar rules applicable to an architect, shall not violate the Professional Conduct Regulations.

2.0 JUDICIAL PRONCEMENTS :

2.1 The Hon'ble Madhya Pradesh High Court in in Writ Petition No. 3917 of 2003, Mukesh Kumar Manhar & another Vs. State of Madhya Pradesh & ors held as under :

19. In the result, this petition is allowed in part as follows :--

(i) The State Government (first respondent) shall cease using the nomenclature "Assistant Architects" or 'Architects' in regard to posts for which the qualification of 'Registered Architect' is not prescribed. It shall also cease designating those who are not registered Architects under the Architects Act, 1972, as 'Architects' or 'Assistant Architects' ;

(ii) If the State Government wants to continue the nomenclature of 'Assistant Architect', 'Architects', then while prescribing the qualification for appointment or promotion to such posts, the requirement that they shall be 'Registered Architects' under the Architects Act, 1972, shall be added.

(iii) The State shall give preference to Registered Architects (under the Architects Act, 1972) for appointment to any post of Architects (that is post involving architectural functions) as provided in Section 35(2) of the Architects Act, 1972.

(iv) The State shall comply with the aforesaid directions within four months from the date of receipt of this order.

2.2 The Hon'ble Tripura High Court in Writ Petition (C) No.191 of 2015, Partha Roy & Others Vs. The State of Tripura & ors, vide order dated 16.12.2016 considered a petition seeking following directions :

i) to issue writ of mandamus to create separate wing/ department of architects and frame separate cadre services rules for the Architects under the Public Works Department, Government of Tripura; and

ii) to direct the respondents authorities to provide promotional avenue for the Architects from the post of Junior Architect Degree Holder (Technical) serving under the Public works Department, Govt. of Tripura.

The Hon'ble High Court has held as under :

We have given our anxious consideration to this submission of the submission of the learned Advocate General. Be that as it may, we cannot be oblivious of the fact that a statutory body like Council of Architecture in its 61st meeting held on 24-02-2014 has passed the following resolution: "10. Creation of separate Architectural wings/departments in all States/UTS and separate cadres of Architects for Architects in Government services." That apart, Mr. D. Sharma, the learned counsel for the Architecture has pointed out to us that even Central Public Works Department has created a separate Architectural Wings in all the States/UTs for its units and as such, it is appropriate the State respondents also create a separate Architectural Wings for its Architectures inasmuch as the functions of the Architecture and the functions of the Engineers cannot be said to be one and the same.

On considering the matter from all angles, we are of the view that this writ petition can be disposed of by directing the State-respondents to examine the case of the petitioners for creation of separate Architectural Wings under the Public Works Department keeping in mind the aforesaid resolution dated 24.02.2014 and the letter dated 22-11-2007 of the Registrar, Council of Architecture, addressed to the Secretary, Public Works Department, Government of Tripura and in accordance with law. Order accordingly. The exercise shall be completed by them within a period of 3(three) months from the date of receipt of this order.

2.3 The Hon'ble Supreme court of India in Civil Appeal No.1819 of 2020, Council of Architecture Vs. Mukesh Goyal & ors, vide order dated 17.03.2020 held that :

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36. If an individual is appointed to a post titled Associate Architect, Architect or Senior Architect, they undoubtedly refer to themselves and are referred to by others as Architects. Holding a post using the term Architect has the real-world consequence of being referred to as an architect. This is not a matter of mere nomenclature. As noted above, architecture is a specialised field of study.

Crucially, the scheme of the Architects Act provides a direct nexus between the minimum educational qualifications required to be obtained, registration as an architect under the Act and the prohibition against the use of the title of Architect by those not registered under the Act. If a government post is titled Architect or Associate Architect, such a person certainly uses the title and style of architect and consequently there is a reasonable assumption that such a person is registered under the Architects Act and holds a degree in architecture recognised by the Act. This assumption finds statutory backing in Section 35 of the Architects Act which provides that any reference to an architect in any other law shall be deemed to mean an architect registered under the Architects Act. To promote an individual who does not possess a degree in architecture recognized by the Act to a post titled Architect, Associate Architect or of a similar style using the title or style of architect would effectively violate the prohibition on the use of title contained in Section 37 of the Architects Act.

3.0 ORGANIZATIONAL SETUP FOR ARCHITECTS:

3.1 The C.P.W.D./P.W.D.s may be bifurcated into two independent departments as there are two distinct functions of planning and construction involved. While the C.P.W.D./P.W.D.s should deal with construction and maintenance of building projects, an independent Department of Architecture shall be established for Architectural Planning & Design. Rather, the two departments should work in coordination to ensure maximum project deliverance as both Planning and Execution are inter-related.

3.2 It is essential that the Department of Architecture as well as the Project executing agencies like C.P.W.D./P.W.D.s should be placed under a single Ministry for better understanding, proper coordination and smooth functioning. Hence, the Department of Architecture and the Project executing agencies shall be placed under the Ministry of Housing & Urban Development at Central Government level and the same shall also be followed in States and Union Territories. The topmost authority heading the Department of Architecture and that of C.P.W.D./ P.W.D.s shall be equivalent in power and status and accountable to its respective Ministry directly. In Public Sector Organisations/ Undertakings/Local Municipal Bodies, the Head of the Architecture Wing shall work directly under the control of the Chairman/Managing Director/ Commissioner, etc. The Annual performance Appraisal (APA) of a qualified Architect should be written by Senior Most Architect of the Architecture Department.

3.3 The Department of Architecture shall be headed by Chief Architect/Architect-



in-Chief as per recommended grade and workload. In the State Governments and Union Territories, the Head of the Department of Architecture shall be designated as Chief Architect even if the workload does not justify it with truncated Circle/Division as per the workload. This will enable him to effectively deal with his counterparts in other Departments. Further, he shall be responsible to assist, guide, recommend and to represent the Government on all matters/issues pertaining to Architectural Planning, Design and Built Environment effectively.

3.4 The Chief Architect is the Principal Technical Adviser to the Government in matters pertaining to architectural issues and his advice is final. Though some states and union territories have granted absolute power to the office of Chief Architect and drawings prepared by this office need no further approval, but in some States, this power comes with riders. As a matter of policy, the architectural drawings prepared by the office of Chief Architect should not require further vetting, as the experts of the subject.

3.5 The subject of land allotment is vested with town planning Departments in most States who also make byelaws pertaining to building construction. The role of Town and Country planning Departments should be restricted to land allotment and zoning plan preparation and the formulation of Bye-laws should also be done in consultation with Architecture Departments as the subject matter pertains to planning of spaces.

3.6 Independent Financial Powers and Administrative control over the budget may be given to the Department of Architecture to ensure total work independence. Separate budget for the Department of Architecture shall be an essential part of budget grants provided by the Ministry of Urban Development in Centre and every State/Union Territory.



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3.7 The Architectural set up may be based on Architectural Zones/States consisting of 3 S.A. (Senior Architect) Circles functioning under the control of the Chief Architect, with each circle comprising of 3 Architectural Divisions headed by the Architect. Each Architectural Division shall be a basic design unit which will function only under a Senior Architect. In exceptional circumstances, where the ex cadre post of Architect cannot be filled due to non-availability of suitable candidate through promotion or direct recruitment, the Architectural Division can be headed by an Asstt. Architect. Further, Asstt. Architects, Junior Architects etc. shall function as team members of this design unit which shall be responsible for design concepts with workload limitations. The number of zones and circles may vary depending on the workload.

3.8 Over the years, the regulatory mechanism in building construction industry has undergone a rapid metamorphic change due to increase in awareness levels on account of new public welfare initiatives such as proclamation of Citizens Charters by various Government Departments which spell out the time periods for service deliveries, RTI Act, Universal Accessibility laws, Strict environment guidelines etc. As a result, the level of litigation has increased substantially in Architecture Departments and most of the times, the Architects remain embroiled in attending court cases rather than doing their core duties of the profession. There should be dedicated post of a legal officer in each Architecture Department.

3.9 The expenditure on the Department of Architecture shall be based on broad parameters of the COA, Manual, Volume 4. i.e. 2.5% of the Project costs dealt with (excluding the departmental charges of all the Engineering services).

3.10 The fees for Architectural services (or Departmental charges) of 2.5% of the project cost may be charged for rendering Architectural services to the projects and recovered from the client/Ministries directly by the Department of Architecture. Before taking up the project designs, the client/Ministry may initially deposit 0.5% of the fees on submission of feasibility report and the remaining balance along with issue of administrative approval for the project or as per the schedule given in the Manual of the Council of Architecture.

4.1 The Architectural service setup shall be Officer Oriented with equal number of officers and staff. The present structure may be upgraded by matching savings for quality, efficiency and better promotional avenues.

4.2 A Central Architectural Service for Architects Pool may be constituted for recruitment of the architects to public service through U.P.S.C. from which the Central and State Governments/Public Sector Undertakings may draw and appoint their group 'A' Officers. Alternatively, the State Governments can work out Capital work (Building works) projections for various Government Departments for the next short term or long term periods and the Departments of Architecture shall be the nodal agency for recruiting the Architects for these works. The cadre strength of the whole state shall rest with the Department of Architecture which may be increased as per requirements. There shall be no independent recruitments by other public sector entities such as Boards and corporations at their own level and dedicated Architecture Units shall be placed by the Architecture Department to handle their work. For short tenure Planning requirements, the recruitment can be through contractual non permanent posts.

4.3 Not only the above measures shall ease the pressure on service delivery but the quality of work shall also improve along with the cut in cost enhancements due to project delays and timelines can be effectively matched. By deputing dedicated Architectural Units for independent Projects, the Government can speed up infrastructure development, handle the aspirations of citizens and create jobs & better career avenues – all at the same time, hence it shall be a win win situation for all.

4.4 The pay-scales, designation and unit composition shall be as uniform as possible in all the architectural set ups throughout the country as approved by the Central / State governments, if not less than the scale referred herein at 7.0.

4.5 There may be provision for liberal exchange and interchangeability of disciplines between two independent Departments for mutual understanding and experience, each contributing equal number of posts.

4.6 An architect, being a professional and a technocrat shall have chances of promotion in the hierarchy at the policy making level. At least one post in Architectural discipline in each State may be of the rank of Architect-in-Chief equivalent to Secretary in the State/Central Government.

4.7 Non-registered Architect shall be designated as Technical Assistant & Technical Officer having their own channel of promotions.

4.8 There may be provision for proactive interaction between the Architects and Educational Institutions of the country for proper coordination & bonding between theory and practice.



265 5.0 WORKLOAD :

5.1 Creation of Architectural units shall be related to the workload as per budget provisions while a distribution of projects among the various Architectural units shall be based on project estimated cost. The workload on estimated cost is 4 times that of Budget provisions as it takes an average of 4 years for a project to mature. The workload may be reckoned every year till the project is alive.

5.2 The standard workload of different Architectural Offices shall be as follows based on 50 times of the expenditure on Architectural Establishment.

| | Budget cost | Estimated cost |
|----------------------------|-------------|----------------|
| (a) Architectural Division | 500 lakh | 1500 lakh |
| (b) Architectural Circle | 1500 lakh | 4500 lakh |
| (c) One Arch. Post Cost | 25 lakh | 75 lakh |

Costs mentioned are not absolute and must be revised upwards based on cost escalation periodically preferably once in every three years. The cost escalation may be based on cost index specified by the Government of India / State Government from time to time.

TIME PERIOD FOR DESIGNING

It is often noticed that time period allowed for designing large scale multi acres site projects does not commensurate with the actual workload and input anticipated. This seriously undermines the quality of work and often the novelty of design theme is ignored to meet stiff timelines. Some States like have mentioned the timelines of projects in their Citizens Charter but the adherence remains a pipedream. All State Governments must circulate the timelines to various departments for adherence so that quality of designing and planning is maintained.

5.2 (a) The Architectural workload shall be calculated based on the estimated cost of the projects at the Department of Architecture/Architectural Wing as follows :

- Preliminary Stage** - 50% of the estimated project cost
- Working Drawing Stage** - 50% of the estimated project cost

5.3 The number of projects that can be easily handled at one time by the Architect Circle may be restricted to say, 30-60 within the workload as per norms.

5.4 The construction of repetitive housing type designs shall be restricted to 500 dwelling units within 3 years period in each of different climatic and cultural zone, whichever is earlier. The specifications for various building types should essentially be in the domain of the Architects including fixing the colour and shades of building materials. The Architects

should be vested with the power to amend the specifications in the interest of any project subject to the provisions of the administrative approval already obtained and there shall be no strain on financial allocations.

5.5 In an era of specializations, it is imperative to create core teams for specialized works pertaining to Conservation and restoration, high rise design, sports infrastructure and hospitals, therefore, the Architecture Departments shall recruit Architects based on the speciality requirements in order to plan state of the art infrastructure. Consultant Architects/Experts shall also be engaged and entrusted with projects upto 2% of total Budget provisions. Schools of Architecture be entrusted with research projects upto 1%. Architectural Assistant may be employed on part-time basis dependent on the projects load.

5.6 Due to fast changing technology, it is necessary that Architect should have wider knowledge and training of latest materials and technique. They shall be sent on deputation to other organizations and specialized training and scholarship under various National and International Schemes within an overall quota of 15-25% of the sanctioned strength and normally requests to this effect shall not be rejected. All Architects who are desirous to undergo higher studies and training, shall be granted study leave as Central / State government rules.

5.7 With the emphasis of the Govt. now for procurement of services of specialized consultants and managed through PMC, EPC has been the latest trend to optimize resources. This process however must ensure that planning is not sacrificed in the process of tendering the projects. This is all the more reasons for the up-gradation and strengthening of the public offices under Urban Development Departments or Chief Architect's Office (as has been done in case of Govt. of Bihar). This will ensure coordination of all the entities in public interest for continuity of projects and carrying an institutional memory for such large public investment projects.

5.8 Besides Architectural planning and designing, Architects also undertake site visits and supervision across the state but the logistics infrastructure is often woefully lacking, it is proposed that staff cars should be made available at Architect Unit level for frequent touring and monitoring.

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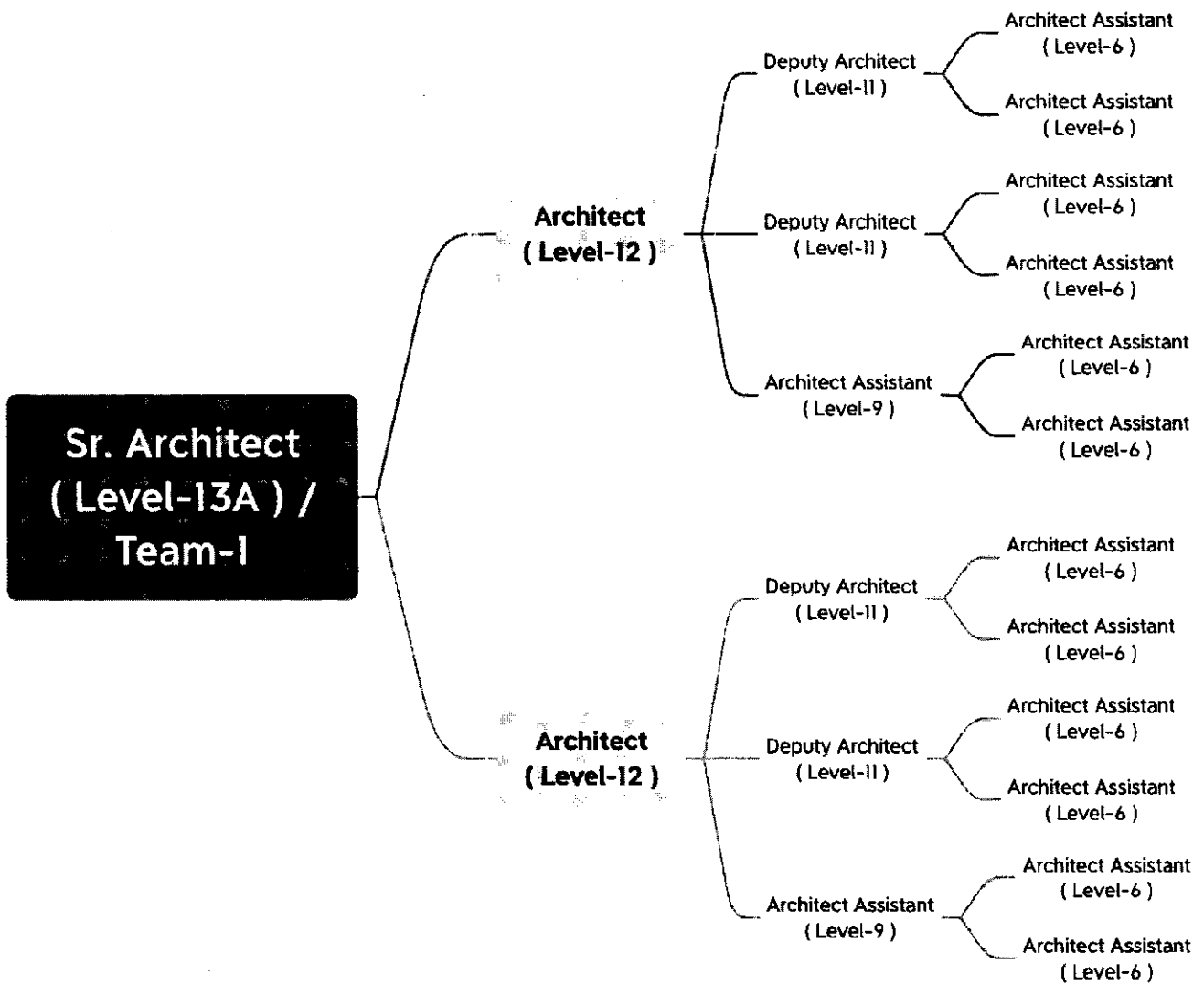
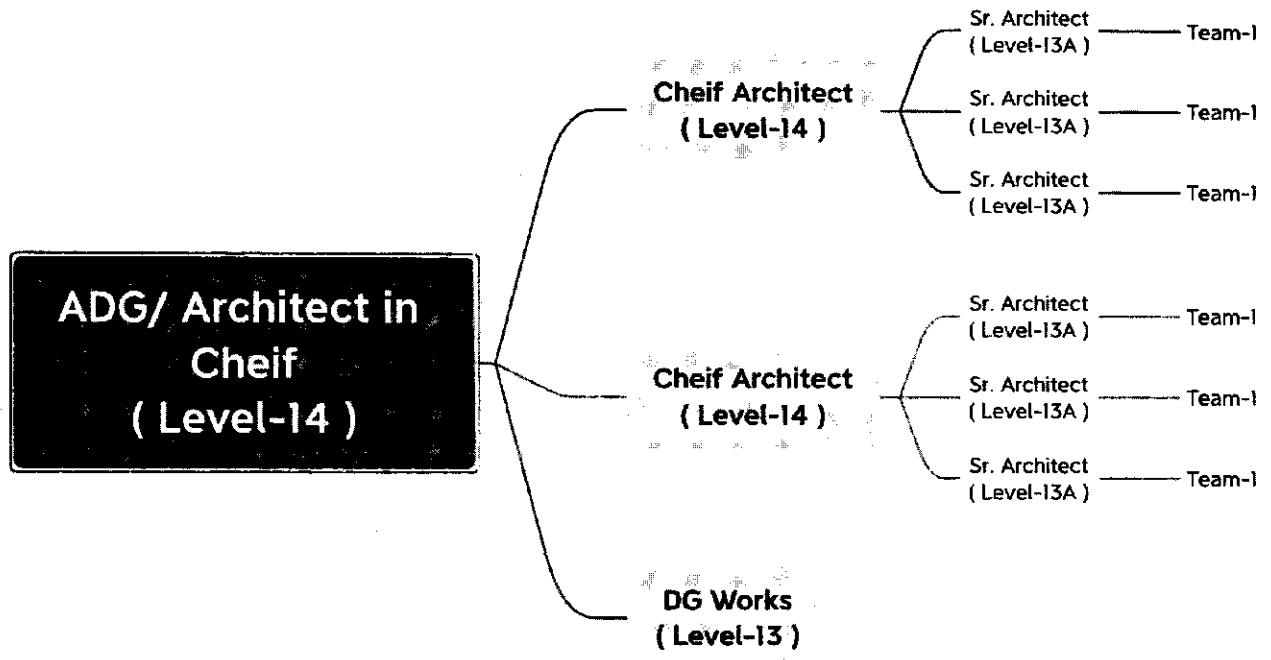
6.0

WORKING CONDITIONS:

- 6.1 Proper work environment shall be provided including computers with software training for all Officers, printers at Architecture Unit levels.
- 6.2 Facilities of communication & conveyance shall be provided for effective functioning.
- 6.3 Documentation and publicity is essential. Necessary equipment shall be identified.
- 6.4 The Annual Renewal Fee/One Time Payment to Council of Architecture shall be borne by the Employer for architects in Govt. Sector/Public Sector/Semi Govt.
- 6.5 Research & Development shall be introduced to improve the quality of design without extra cost. Wide publicity of Architectural Projects is desirable.
- 6.6 Awards for best architectural design may be given to encourage better concepts.
- 6.7 Independent design responsibility shall be entrusted at various levels according to scope and volume of the projects and shall be worked out by the Officer himself for in-depth design values.
- 6.8 Non-practicing monthly allowance shall be extended to architects in public service similar to doctors in Government Departments. The allowance shall be 10 to 15% of the basic salary.

COMPOSITION OF DEPARTMENT OF ARCHITECTURE AND ESTABLISHMENT:

561 Each Deptt. shall be equipped to handle all types of works from Planning, building design, Landscape, Conservation and Heritage, Urban Design, transport planning including software support on project management, with a modular / base unit at the level of an Architect's office with supporting staff of Assistant Architect, Architectural Assistant, Head Draftsman, Senior Draftsman, Modeler, Draftsman, Junior Draftsman, and Ferro Printer with average workload of each Architectural Unit headed by an Architect to 50 Crore per annum to justify the administrative and financial cost to the Govt., as compared to appointment of private consultants.

7.1 Apart from the above architectural cadre, full-fledged establishment with supporting Clerical, Ministerial and Non-Ministerial staff, Ferro-Printer, Record keeper, Computer Operator etc. shall be provided.

Since Architecture Offices are primarily Design Cells located in State Head Quarters and require frequent interaction with HODs, clients higher Authorities, therefore, the Offices are best located in the State Head quarters unless under compelling circumstances.

7.2 Since the number of posts in Architectural cadre is limited, time bound enhancement of scales shall be considered favorably and may be granted on attaining stipulated levels of proficiency & work efficiency and as per the need & requirement of the situation. The period for timebound enhanced scales shall be between 3 to 5 years.

Dear Sir(s),

The Indian Parliament of India has enacted the Architects Act, 1972, to regulate the standard of the Architectural Education and Profession in the Country. The Council has also been vested with the responsibility of registering Architects on all India basis similar to Bar Council, Institution of Chartered Accountants of India and National Medical Commission.

The Govt's initiatives such as "Smart Cities", "Housing for All, Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojna, AMRUT, Namami Gange, and construction of public buildings like, Secretariat, Courts, Jails, Hospitals, Police Stations, Museum, Hotels, Stadiums, Highways and Expressways, Guest Houses, Row Housing, etc. requires essential contribution from the Architects.

The role of architects in the construction of buildings extends beyond building design. They are entrusted with creating environments that provide warmth, comfort, and protection against both natural and human-made extremes. Their responsibilities include ensuring the efficient utilization of space, natural resources, energy, and construction materials, while simultaneously upholding aesthetic values that harmonize with the cultural and historical context.

The Council's attention has repeatedly been drawn to the limited role assigned to architects in the construction of public buildings and the lack of recruitment to fill vacant posts in the architectural cadre. It has also been brought to the Council's notice that non-architects are being promoted or appointed to posts carrying the designation "Architect" or involving the duties and functions of an architect in government departments and local authorities.

In this regard, we would like to inform you that the Hon'ble Madhya Pradesh High Court in Mukesh Kumar Manhar v/s. State of Madhya Pradesh vide judgment dated 02.08.2005 held as under:

Para 19:

- i) *"The State Government (first respondent) shall cease using the nomenclature "Assistant Architects" or "Architects" in regard to posts for which the qualification of "Registered Architect" is not prescribed. It shall also cease designating those who are not registered Architects under the Architects Act, 1972, as 'Architects' or 'Assistant Architects'.*

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Thus, the State Governments are requested to not to allow non-Architects to be appointed/promoted to any post which carries the title and style of an Architect and/or duties and functions of an Architect.

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Accordingly, it is humbly requested that appropriate directions be issued to concerned Departments/ Local Authorities/ Urban Local Bodies/ Panchayati Raj Institutions:

- a) To comply with the provisions of the Architects Act, 1972 so that the non-architects may not be appointed to posts carrying the designation 'Architect' in government departments and other local authorities.
- b) To strengthen the Cadre of Architects in your State in Govt. Departments/ PSUs/ Local Bodies like PWD, Works, Road & Buildings, Development Authorities, Municipal Corporations etc. in well-structured and pyramidal manner in line with the Guidelines of the Council.

It is further requested that Council may be kept posted with the action taken in the matter.
